## Adopt Section 165 of Article 10 of Division 2 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations as follows:

## § 165. Continuing education coursework regarding disability access requirements.

\* \* \* \*

(d) A provider shall only issue a certificate of completion to a participant who:

<u>(1) completes an in-person or live webinar course, or</u>

(2) takes a <u>pre-</u>recorded course not presented live or presented by recorded webinar and <del>upon the participant's</del> successfully pass esingage of a testsummative assessment of the participant's knowledge and understanding of the CE coursework at the end of the period of instruction (post-course test"). The assessment shall have "Successfully passing" shall mean a minimum cumulative passing score of at least seventy eighty-percent (§70%).

(h) Within fiveten business days from the administration completion of the post-course, test, or the passing of the test of a recorded course, aA-provider shall issue withinfive business days of the assessment a certificate of completion to each participant, who successfully passes the testassessment described subject to the requirements in subsection (d). The certificate of completion shall include the information specified in section 5600.05(b) of the code.

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
